#### WHERRY YACHT CHARTER CHARITABLE TRUST UPDATE

On Sunday 1 May 2022 Olive and Norada, two of our wherry yachts, will be escorting pleasure wherry Hathor to How Hill before the wherry yachts return to our base at Wroxham. These first trips will be refresher and new crew training for our volunteers only but then they will be available for charters and scheduled sailings.



Hathor will be moored near Toad Hole Cottage, How Hill, from 1 May until 30 September 2022 and on many days WYC volunteers will open the wherry (free of charge, though donations are always welcome) for visitors to look around her Egyptian-themed interior. She will also act as our education wherry with school groups visiting How Hill brought down to see her and to learn about some of the history of wherries on the broads. Hathor will be sailing to Barton Broad and back on various dates, including some special fully catered trips featuring delicious home-made food. She will also sail to Womack Water to be on view during Ludham Open Gardens on Sunday 25 June 2022 before returning to How Hill.

Scheduled day sailings on our wherry yachts include firm favourites to Salhouse Broad, Ranworth, South Walsham and How Hill, and Steam and Sail in partnership with the Museum of the Broads' launch "Falcon". And this year there are trips on the Thurne above Potter Heigham, taking in the peaceful surroundings of Hickling and Horsey for the first time in a number of years. We are also offering a few luxury day sailings on pleasure wherry Ardea, the last wherry to be built in 1927. With dates from May right through to September we hope you will find something to suit. There will also be Broadland Heritage and Wherry Experience residential breaks based at How Hill with sailings on our wherries. Details and booking for these are via www. howhilltrust.org.uk.

At the time of writing this article (06.04.22) it is recommended that you should wait until around 6 months since your last dose of vaccine for maximum effectiveness.

If you are 12 years and over and Immunocompromised, you are eligible for the spring booster if there has been at least three months from your previous dose. However, as we will be delivering the Moderna vaccine those aged 12-18 will need to access the Pfizer vaccine through the mass vaccination centres.

If you are feeling unwell please wait until you have recovered to have your vaccine, please do not attend a vaccine appointment if you are waiting for the result of a Covid 19 test. If you contract Covid 19 please wait until at least 4 weeks before having your spring booster.



# The 'Manor' houses owned by the Burroughes family by Robert Maidstone

In 1766 Reverend Randall Burroughes bought the Manor of Stratton Hall. In modern terms Manors were just big estates usually comprising of several farms, land and properties. Often, but not always, one farm was lived in by the Lord of the Manor and called 'the Manor house/farm'. In Stratton the principal farm was on Hall Lane, the property we now know as the Hall, and was then called the Manor House.

Randall lived in the Manor House and was rector of both Shelfanger and Bressingham although he probably employed a curate to take services for him while he himself was curate at Wacton from 1780.

His son Ellis Randall was also ordained a priest, being of Long Stratton Manor, and taking first the living at Stowupland in 1790, then Sutton in 1792, and Tasburgh in 1802 although he lived at Stratton. He became curate of Stratton St Michael and Morningthorpe in 1814 and 1815 respectively.

Meanwhile he had married Sarah Nasmyth Marsh in 1795 and they eventually had 11 children, of the five boys one died shortly after birth but the others grew up. The eldest Ellis became a the curate of Morningthorpe in 1820, married Elizabeth Phillips Wilder in 1823 and moved to Newton Flotman. The next, Walter, too became a priest but never married, he lived at Morningthorpe becoming curate of Starston, Tharston and Wacton before his death in 1850. The third son Robert Marsh joined the East India Company and was the 2nd Officer when he died onboard the Sir David Scott in the Java sea in 1833. The last son Randall Ellis became a solicitor in Norwich, he too never married.

In 1829 the Manor House was described as "a well situated house surrounded by a deep moat" which may well have described the property we now know as 'Hall Farm' as the 1839 Tithe Commutation Map shows no buildings between the corner of The Street and Flowerpot lane and up to where Manor road now is.

Ellis Randall died in 1832 at Stratton and until his wife Sarah, died in 1838, it appears the unmarried girls lived in the Manor House on Hall Lane, but by the 1841 Census were living in Morningthorpe with Walter.

Of the boys Ellis, Walter and Randall Ellis all owned property in Wacton and Long Stratton and probably elsewhere.

Sometime after 1832, Ellis moved back to Stratton and it would appear he built 'Stratton House' a new red brick mansion house that is described in the March edition of the Sexton's Wheel. It is possible that Ellis let the Manor House on Hall Lane.

Ellis and Elizabeth had two children both of whom went to school in Brussels, Ellis Phillips who died aged 19 in Germany and Randall Robert who married Jane Sarah Bax in 1855. Ellis died in 1854 in Sardinia

Randall Robert was a Colonel in the 3rd Battalion of the Norfolk Regiment and a JP. He lived in Stratton House in 1861 with his wife and they had five girls. By 1871 it appears they had became estranged as Jane and the girls were living in Cheltenham, and Randall Robert was lodging in London where he was an MP for Norfolk. In 1883 he was referring to the house as the Manor House in the register of electors but I can find no census records to confirm where the family were living, maybe they were abroad.

Randall Robert died in 1888 in Florence, and it appears he left his wife a life interest in the Stratton estate so little was sold off until after Jane died in 1909. It appears Jane and four of the daughters did register to vote as occupiers of the Manor House in 1898 and 1900 however by 1911 they were living at Eastbourne.

Meanwhile Randall Ellis had died in 1898 and his estate was too being sold up, with parts presumably left to Randall Robert and then to the latter's girls.

So not only did the Burroughes name their sons Randall or Ellis, or a combination of them, but they owned two houses that were called at one time 'the Manor House' and two members of the family owned farming esates in and around Stratton that were sold off around the same time.

#### A Norfolk ruin and a Suffolk dragon

The first Monday of April started with rain and continued to be gloomy and squally. Only four people set out to explore the delights of Scole. The spring flowers (all natural) on the graves around Scole church certainly brightened the scene. We discovered that Scole church was burnt down in 1963, a sad story, but we did admire the resulting comfortable chairs and brilliant modern stained glass.

We walked up what some of us remembered as the old Norwich Road then turned right towards the playing field where we joined a footpath. Blackthorn was still blossoming but stitchwort, red and white dead nettles and cow parsley were coming out underneath. We came to a very high black



fence which, to judge by the chimneys, must be concealing a magnificent house. No sooner past here than another mystery came into sight: a high flint tower, divided in two, and standing in the middle of a field [picture]. The OS map had prepared us for "St Mary's church (remains of)". A hunt through a list of Norfolk ruined churches on Google led to a clear picture of the ruin just as we had seen. However it was described as "St Andrew Bickerston, another medieval village that no longer exists." There was no information at the site so the mystery remains (unless any Sexton's Wheel reader has any information, of course.)

From the ruin we had a fine view of Billingford windmill looking resplendent with shining white sails. After following some of Angles Way we turned away from the windmill past a field of rape which was already coming into flower. The wind hit us as we walked uphill. Cowslips by the path were tossed in all directions but soon bounced back, (picture). We turned into a lane where a solitary picturesque cottage surprised us by being number



47. We never did find the remaining 46!

This walk was a figure of eight so we soon rejoined the path by the ruin but then diverged to come back into Scole along Bungay Road. It wasn't quite midday and the sun was making a brave attempt to shine so we took a diversion into Suffolk. It was hard to imagine that the quiet lane and pedestrian bridge had once been the main Norwich Road. We played Pooh sticks on the bridge and sat for a while on a bench looking at the River Waveney from the Suffolk side. By the car park of Scole Pocket Park we visited the Scole dragon [picture]. It was looking a bit battered but was still magnificent.

Our final surprise as we returned to our car was to find the famous Scole Inn was turning into an old people's home. That could be a great place to live but not yet!
