Habit Bundling.

'What's your favourite season of the year?' Just one of many questions you'll be bombarded with if you use social media. This type of question seems perfectly innocent, but it is part of a process designed to get you to reveal increasingly more personal information which can then be used to hack your accounts online. Sneaky these cyber thieves! I don't play their game. However, I'm happy to share with you that my favourite season is Spring because of its promise of sunshine, the new life we see all around and because it contains Easter, which I love, not because of the chocolate eggs, but as I can celebrate the greatest gift of love ever given, by God to each of us. The gift of His Son, who died that we might each be forgiven, even if we are the most unworthy person in the world. I am reminded too that He cares for us and has a plan for each of us.

My second favourite season is Autumn, as I love to wrap up warm, go for walks to blow the cobwebs out of my mind and enjoy the changing colours of the trees. I was out for one of those walks today, enjoying a cup of coffee, sitting on one of the many benches mercifully scattered liberally around the fine city of Norwich, when I overheard two ladies on the next bench discussing a painted stone they'd found placed on their seat. It had written on it, 'Jeremiah 29:11 I have...plans to give you hope and a future'. I recently learned about what was called 'habit bundling', which is where you take something you already do and attach a new thing to it that you want to do. For example, you always take a break to have a coffee each morning. Almost religiously you might say (sorry couldn't resist it). You want to read the latest Cormoran Strike book, so you read that while you drink your coffee. You go for a run each day, so you listen to Arlo Park's latest album via your Airpods (trust me it's cool). You get the idea. What activity could you 'habit bundle', adding learning about God's love for you? I used to have a long train journey to work each day where I read emails, did work on my laptop and had a sleep. One Christmas I was given a book of Bible readings, thoughts and prayers for each day of the year. I added that to my routine. As a result, each day was shaped by it, and I learned more of God's plan for me.

In the second best season of the year, perhaps you can 'habit bundle' and learn more of what God promised, that the ladies found quoted on that painted stone, 'Jeremiah 29:11 'I have...plans to give you hope and a future'.

Outline of our Village Past

Meanwhile, in Wacton.....

By the end of the middle ages (about 1500), Long Stratton had fallen into the pattern that it would assume for the rest of time - a ong straggling beside the Roman Road, with churches in the fields to the north and on the road near the southern tip. The same forces that shaped Stratton - the Saxon and Norman invasions, the immense profitability of the wool industry, and the Black Death, also affected the life and development of Wacton. Again, as at Stratton, a few reminders of those ancient times still remain in the village today.

At the Conquest, the greater part of Wacton was handed, like many of the lands of Stratton to Alan, Earl of Richmond. He, or one of his successors gave his manor in Wacton the title 'Parks Manor'. It is tempting to link this name with the present Park Farm, part way up the road to Wacton Common.

Two Villages

The Domesday Book also records for us the information that at the time of the survey (1086), there was not one village of Wacton but two. Great Wacton with its church of All Saints, was the Wacton of today, but there was also Little Wacton with its church of St Mary's a few hundred yards to the west. The records describe fairly precisely the location of this church, which is in a field now the property of the Wilderness, and when ploughing occasionally it still reveals some minor relic.

Perhaps Little Wacton was one of those communities which never survived the Black Death of 1349. Its church is described as 'disused' in 1500, and 'decayed' by 1520. Nevertheless, one very important survival, the parcel gilt Holy Communion chalice of Wacton today is a reminder of this period of the past. It bears the inscription 'Wakton Parva'...'Little Wacton'.

Perhaps the energy of the people of both Wactons went into the rebuilding of the present All Saints Church in about 1380. The interior walls were richly painted in those days and surviving accounts describe St Christopher over the north door, with Moses and Aaron to the left and Noah's ark to the right.

Four Hundredth Anniversary

1976 was an important year for Wacton, for it was the four hundredth anniversary of the appointment to the Bishop of London of Wacton's most famous son.

John Aylmer was born at Wacton Hall in 1521. He became a wanted man when Mary came to the throne (1547) and had to flee the country. Rumour had it that he hid in a false compartment built into a barrel of wine. When soldiers boarded the ship to search for him they were given glasses of wine from a tap on the front of the barrel, and therefore never bothered to check the rest of the barrel in the search for him. He was Bishop of London from 1576 to 1594.

TENNIS AT CARLTON ROAD

Carleton Rode Jubilee Hall and Social Club Committee have been working hard over the last 18 months not just to keep the facility open for the community and remain Covid-safe but have also been pushing forward plans to resurface the existing tennis court. Thanks to some very generous grants from the National Lottery, Sport England, Saffron Housing Association, Carleton Rode Parish Council, Bernard Sunley Foundation and most recently, the Norfolk County Council Social Infrastructure Fund, the project finally came to fruition last week to the delight of local residents. The project sees what was an uneven and dangerous hard court replaced with a new multipurpose surface which will accommodate a range of community sports including football, hockey, tennis and basketball - with the added feature of all-weather floodlights to allow play over the darker months. 



This month I touch on a very sensitive and yet important aspect of health. The mental wellbeing of our adolescents. The World Health Organisation in September 2020 wrote a comprehensive document on mental health in adolescents and I will try and summarise important facts from it.

- 1. One in six people are aged 10 19 years
- 2. 16% of the health burden in the 10 19 year olds is due to mental health
- Half of all mental health conditions start around 14 years of age but are undetected and untreated.
- 4. Globally, depression is one of the leading causes of illness and disability among adolescents.
- 5. The consequences of not addressing adolescent mental health problems extends into adulthood impairing both physical and mental health thereby limiting their opportunity to lead fulfilling lives as adults.

NHS Digital has looked at the UK stats. There has been a rise in mental health problems in the adolescents. The figures show that the incidence of mental health in school children has risen from one in ten children in 2004 to one in nine children in 2017 to an alarming one in six children in 2020. As a community we are responsible for our next generation. Parents, family, neighbours, schools and health care and charities have to work together to ensure the physical and most importantly mental well-being of our adolescents to ensure that they grow into happy and functioning members of society. In other words, we must ensure a future healthy society.

Wacton's Poor Cottages By Robert Maidston

By virtue of the Poor Relief Act of 1601 the parish overseers, appointed by the church council, were directed "to raise...by taxation...of every occupier of lands, houses,... coal mines or saleable underwoods... competent sums of money for...the necessary relief of the... poor and not able to work...out of the same parish according to the ability of the same parish".

Many parishes used some of the rate charged to acquire and maintain a small number of dwellings for the poor, Wacton had a block of three cottages and a single cottage at the north end of the Green next to the road from Great Moulton to Stratton.

Then in 1834 the Poor Law Amendment Act came into force. This Act required the Poor Law Commissioner to group parishes together in statutory "Unions of Parishes" which would then administer the relief of the poor. Each Union was then required to construct a workhouse. Wacton was in the Depwade Union and that Union decided to build their workhouse near the boundary of Pulham Market on the main Norwich to Ipswich road. The running costs of the Unions were funded by contributions from the parish rates collected by the parish overseers.

The two church wardens and two overseers of Wacton decided to sell the Poor Cottages and use the money raised as their contribution to the Union expenses. On 23rd October 1837 they sold the cottages in two lots. The single cottage was bought by Charles Batley, his father had been the occupier of the poor cottage and it appears Charles and his deceased brother's wife, Elizabeth, lived there too. The block of three was bought by John Harris, who lived in the cottages opposite the church in Wacton.


In 1865 Batley mortgaged his property to raise £20 and I feel it is likely he used this to build a new cottage on the south of the plot nearer the Green. This cottage still exists behind Victoria Cottages. Then in 1870 Batley sold the cottage to Robert Ludkin and moved to Alburgh.

Meanwhile Harris also raised money on mortgage and probably used it to erect buildings next to the road and let them as a blacksmiths shop to William Dade. Despite this income by 1843 he was in default of repayment. He later agreed to sell the property to George Carthew, a solicitor from Harleston.

After a couple of years Carthew sold the cottages to Daniel and Susan Sheldrake of Long Stratton. Daniel was a carpenter and the deeds tell us the purchase monies belonged to Susan. Daniel died in 1864 and Susan in 1868. Her executors sold the property to Robert Ludkin in 1871.

Fortunately the deeds throughout this period list the names of the occupiers partly for the purpose of identifying the properties as no plans are included. The occupiers names include Alderton, Peart, Dye, Dade, Stimpson, Pettitt and Ludkin, many of these families histories have been researched.

However the Ordnance Survey Map of 1884 gives us an idea of the layout. Next to the cross roads is the site of the Chapel that Ludkin sold in 1885, the blacksmiths shop lies along side the road; in the middle is the row of old cottages and what must be Batley's new cottage is marked in the right hand plot.



After Robert Ludkin died in 1886 the property was sold to the Rev Edward Taylor Chadwick of Wacton Rectory. In 1887 seven new cottages were built on the site – Victoria Cottages.

In the future I will look at the history of Victoria Cottages and the occupiers up to 1959 when the sitting tenants were offered the chance to buy the individual cottages. (622w).

Forward to Mill Lane and then a difficult stile into a field of cows, fortunately not in the least inquisitive about us. At the far end of the field, the stile was even more difficult to negotiate, not helped by a hawthorn close

to it and no upright to hold on to. We then followed footpaths up to Hall Lane and down to Heather's other favourite place, which you've already guessed, I'm sure. St Mary's Church was beautifully decorated for a harvest flower festival: dahlias, sunflowers, alstroemerias, Chinese lanterns, prints from Messy Church. That seemed a fitting end to a pleasant and interesting walk – but more was to come. Heather invited all eight of us back for a hearty lunch of hot soup and crusty bread. What a treat. 
