

Celebration of Licensed Lay Ministry

In our diocese we have over 200 Licensed Lay Ministers (LLMs, sometimes known as Readers) actively ministering in their benefices each week, as teachers of the faith, enablers of mission, and leaders in church and community.

Warden of Readers, Archdeacon Karen, says "Licensed Lay Ministers are people whose vocation to serve God in a variety of ways has been recognised and supported with good training, and whose ministry is licensed by the Bishop. They lead home groups and confirmation classes; they are involved in baptism preparation and follow-up; they visit and take the sacraments to the sick, elderly and house-bound; they lead school assemblies and work with youth groups and music groups; and many are also trained to conduct funerals."

Bitesize prayers

When the pandemic hit, St Edmund's Church in Taverham, like all across the diocese, had to close the door of its ancient building. Standing as a beacon of light for over 900 years in this large suburb just north of Norwich, the team quickly re-thought their ministry. Despite little experience of digital communication, they adapted, initially simply using a smart phone, and took Sunday services, toddler tunes, youth group and prayers online, broadcasting live via their Facebook page.

Many of these continue to run, even as the building has reopened. A daily "bitesize prayer" time is recorded by different people from the church, and weekly "midweek moments" has a Bible reading, reflection, and prayer. Worship leader and families worker Rachel Seabrook says, "Listening to God and to each other is the gracious invitation God offers us in prayer, learning to love God and our neighbour in more Christ-like ways."

This charity supports those new to Norwich – often refugees and asylum seekers – through English classes in city churches, but the '+' in its title refers to everything else on offer to help people integrate well and form friendships. Such things as driving and cooking lessons, one-to-one support and trips into the country ended with the first lockdown. All classes went online, the delivery of food and medical supplies became vital and special efforts were made to support the isolated.

This autumn, with a new blend of onsite and online services, the making of friendships and the rebuilding of community is the chief task. Fear of the virus has deepened the isolation of lonely newcomers with little English and those whose already precarious jobs ended with lockdown still find it difficult to feed their children. Director Rosie Sexton asks us to pray that her team finds those who need them most.



Zoom room prayer

Internet technology has brought us the blessing of gathering in prayer online, enabling people to respond in the fellowship of others, whatever our circumstances. At the height of the second wave of the pandemic, healthcare chaplain Helen Garrard organised weekly 'Prayer for Care' vigils, lifting our NHS acute and community services and surrounding them in prayer. It was a powerful experience which bore witness to the situation at that time. Each hour was marked by a psalm and prayer and the time in between filled with silent and sometimes spoken words of devotion.

Throughout the pandemic and beyond, first one and then two 30-minute midweek zoom prayer rooms have opened at Holy Trinity, Norwich, one early morning (7:15am) and one mid-morning (10am). Again, a psalm or other verses are used as a focus and the groups gather in fellowship, interceding for the church and the world.

Many ways to pray

However long prayer has been part of our lives, it's good to take the long view from time to time. Do our regular ways of praying give us life and nourish our faith? Reflection is always healthy, creating a space into which God's Spirit can blow afresh.

his new-look Prayer Diary is the result of such reflection and the year ahead in which our diocese will focus on letting Christ transform us to be more prayerful, will offer us myriad opportunities for more reflection, more Spirit-given newness.

The visual arts, for example, can stir our souls profoundly. The Flower Seller (1942) [left] by Diego Rivera not only leads us into prayer but also teaches us about prayer.

A Mexican girl with neatly braided hair kneels before an enormous bunch of Calla lilies. She leans into the flowers, extending a tender embrace around them. Her head is slightly bowed. There is a deep stillness about her. She is utterly attentive. In short, her body is set in an attitude of absorbed prayer. Her unshod feet underline this: she is on holy

ground and we, witnessing this moment, know ourselves to be on holy ground too. We cannot help being drawn in, mesmerised by the quality of the girl's attentiveness. As Bishop Simon Phipps once said, "Prayer is absolute attention to what is the case".

There's something else about the child. In the vulnerability of her naked feet and in her widely extended arms, we glimpse something cross-like, Christ-like. Through her praying, she has, then, allowed the life of Jesus to come alive in her and she shows us how, as we pray, we can mirror his wide-armed, self-giving embrace of the whole world.

So, what about those flowers? Well, they fill the whole painting, bigger than the girl herself, their scale overwhelming. When we settle down to pray for those around us or for the world at large, the sheer scale of need can overwhelm. This Prayer Diary helps by taking one 'lily' at a time: one benefice a day with its parishes and people and schools; one facet of life in our own diocese (the care of those living with dementia for example); one diocese far beyond our region but joined to us though Christ.

Our little flower-seller teaches us about stillness and attentiveness in prayer and inspires us to let the transforming presence of Jesus flow through us as we pray. But look how the canvas glows! The girl has deliberately let that presence flow from her into each of the flowers in her embrace – "holding them in The Light" as Quakers say. Each lily is lit from within, luminous as if with Christ's risen presence.

We too, inspired by this painting, can flood those for whom we pray with the transforming light of Christ, and with St Paul, trustingly proclaim, "Everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Cor 5:17).

Racial Injustice

We acknowledge racial injustice exists and abhor this injustice. However, it is tempting to feel exempt and avoid praying with integrity around the subject. Picture a conversation (in a garden, warm with sunshine) where the question was posed, "How should the diocese pray?" There was a change in mood, a chill, and a sadness.

The intelligent young woman, a junior doctor, first generation UK, responded with sensitivity and restraint, as she described the impact of overt and covert comments regarding the colour of her skin, her race, which eventually began to damage her self-esteem.

"People talk down at you, dismiss you, or use their position to damage your integrity and professionalism, knowing they will suffer little consequence, because you (black people) are not as valued in society." She asked for prayer for our local community to step out and be open to form friendships with those who are different from themselves.

Committing to climate change

The UK is hosting the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow from 1 – 12 November. The COP26 summit brings parties together to accelerate action towards the goals of the Paris Agreement and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The Paris Agreement's long-term goal is to keep global temperature rise below 2°C from pre-industrial levels, with the hope to keep it as close to 1.5°C as possible. But at the moment, the world is on course to miss this target. That's why many parties hope that COP26 will be an opportunity for countries to strengthen their commitment to taking action to reduce climate change.

Grief and Loss

I was on holy ground recently making space to talk about loss. My friend commented on a new ease of granting people permission to talk about death, where such conversations were less acceptable pre-pandemic. I heard of the grieving of three loved ones, two vigorous men in the prime of their lives and one elderly father. One of the men was a friend from commuting to London and the other was a known and loved schoolfriend, and an NHS frontline worker.

Yes, grief was apparent, questions and sadness, however this story was more about journeying on with the widows and families of those who had died. I heard of endless practical support, sorting finances and packing up a house, also the apparent random clicking of friendships, laughter down the phone, the surprisingly effective support through text messages, everything gratefully attributed to the thread of God's Spirit being at work.



Two's Company

This is a new telephone befriending service to which five churches from the Great Yarmouth area signed up last spring. Anna Heydon, Development Worker for 'Imagine Norfolk Together', oversees the project and receives the referrals. Then lonely, isolated people are linked up with volunteers who offer social connection by ringing weekly for a chat. Now that restrictions have eased, face-to-face contact may gently start to replace the telephone and invitations be offered to a range of events within the wider faith community.

Although lockdown has highlighted loneliness, it did not, in most cases, cause it. Loneliness was already a prevalent sickness and not just among the elderly – one of those benefitting from Two's Company is a young mum alone with children. Her loneliness won't end with the pandemic, but Anna's prayer is that she and all those befriended will, in their contact with the befrienders, glimpse something of God's love.

Anna Chaplaincy

When her mother was in care, Gaye Hailstone knew that her spiritual needs were simply not being met. It sharpened Gaye's sense "of the importance of including those in care homes as a vital part of our church family." With her Rector's encouragement, she now leads a team who regularly take short, simple acts of worship into the four care homes of the villages of the Yare Valley Churches – or, during Covid, outside them, as pictured. The congregations – growing in each home – are engaged, responsive and deeply appreciative.

So, what's next? Recognition of and support for this ministry is planned through a formal connection (to be shared, it's hoped, by other churches across our diocese) with the national network of Anna Chaplains. Named after the 84-year-old who waited upon God with faithfulness and insight (Luke 2. 36-38), theirs is a vision of "a pioneering, targeted ministry among people in their later years".


